ANNUAL MEETING

The 40 residents of Heritage Glen who attended the September 29, 2004, annual meeting learned that our association's financial situation is better than it was last year. There was a small but growing balance due to good management of the monthly Association fee. Best Irrigation has been replaced by Land Maintenance, the firm that cuts/trims our grass in the summer and removes snow in the winter. Land Maintenance is slightly less expensive, and now all ground will be coordinated work completed by the same company. There was agreement that the lawns are maintained in a very satisfactory manner.

Specifications for snow removal procedures at Heritage Glen:

- Snow plowing will begin after 2" of snow has accumulated
- 2-6" of snow will be removed within 12 hours of completion of the snowfall
- Greater depths will be removed within increasingly longer designated lengths of time
- Driveways will be opened before 7:00 a.m. or 5:00 p.m.

- Shoveling of sidewalks, hydrants and mailboxes will be completed after all normal plowing is complete, and will take place during daylight hours
- The contractor can call off shoveling if temperatures are
 -5 degrees or lower and/or wind chills are -15 degrees or lower
- Contractor is not responsible for snow within 3 feet of parked vehicles.

REMINDERS

* For safety and security reasons, please keep your garage doors closed. More children and adults will be walking about the neighborhood in warmer weather.

* If you have a diseased or dead association-maintained tree, notify Jim Auer or any board member.

*As the snow melts, check the grounds of your home - rubbish and litter accumulate during the winter. Your cooperation in picking up this trash will make our development look better and won't take much time.

* Please place your trash and recycling on the curb <u>early</u> Thursday mornings, or <u>after dark</u> Wednesdays.

SPRING MAINTENANCE

The maintenance committee will deliver paint to residences not involved in last year's project. Residents of Bluebird Alcove and half of Bluebird Lane (up to the corner of Blue Heron) received their paint and should have completed painting of all surfaces that face the street, i.e. outside door trim, garage door trim, deck posts and railings. The committee has a list of each house color and the amount needed to complete the project. For remaining residents, after the paint is delivered to you, please make every effort to complete your painting by mid-June.

With spring appear brown spots due to pets. Individual homeowners are responsible for pet markings and damage. A city ordinance requires that we pick up after our pets regardless of where we are. If you see non-Heritage Glen residents failing to clean up after their pets, please inform them of their responsibility.

Land Maintenance will repair damage from their plows.

Newspapers and junk mail may be placed together but must be in a paper grocery-type bag and placed into the bin or on top of the cans/glass/plastic. Please insure your papers are contained to prevent being blown away in the wind.
