ROUNDABOUT IS OPEN

If you haven't yet been through the Radio Drive/Bailey Road Roundabout, following are some simple steps to navigate it safely:

- Think ahead and choose the correct lane for your destination.
- To turn right or go straight, stay in the right lane.
- To turn left, get into the left lane.

They are either recycled or refurbished; during refurbishing the memory is wiped out to allow for reprogramming.
