WINTER PARKING

Woodbury's winter parking restrictions are now in effect. City ordinance PROHIBITS ON-STREET PARKING:

- BETWEEN 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., NOVEMBER 1 THROUGH APRIL 1.
- ANY TIME 2 OR MORE INCHES OF SNOW HAVE ACCUMULATED UNTIL AFTER

THE STREET IS COMPLETELY PLOWED.

CONTRACT PLOWING

The Heritage Glen contact with A-1 Maintenance, Inc. has been extended for two years. Following are guidelines for snow removal:

- 1. Snowfall accumulation of 1.5" or more will be removed.
- 2. Driveways will be opened up to allow access prior to 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. when continuous accumulation reaches 4 inches.
- 3. Driveways will be thoroughly cleared within 8 hours of the end of a 1.5" to 8" snowfall and within 12 hours of cessation of snow depths exceeding 8".
- A snowfall lasting 24 hours or more with accumulation of at least 1.5 inches will be cleared.
- 5. Driveways that become closed by city plows will be opened.
- 6. Sidewalks will be cleared using the same guidelines as above.
- 7. Snow accumulations will be cleared around fire hydrants and in front of mailboxes.
- 8. Detailing will be done in front of doors and doorways.

- 9. A-1 Maintenance is not responsible for damage to any electrical cords buried under the snow on sidewalks.
- 10. Sidewalk snow removal will be delayed if wind chill temperatures reach 25 degrees below zero until after safer conditions prevail.
