THE BOARD "TWEETS"

The Heritage Glen Townhome Association would like to thank the homeowners for their overwhelming response to our recent ballot.

On October 3, we mailed ballots to all homeowners requesting their vote to amend our Bylaws regarding townhome rentals. We are very pleased to have received 86 signed ballots. The result was 76 in favor and only 10 against, therefore the amendment passed.

Your participation as homeowners indicates your pride in our community which is indeed gratifying to us.

WINTER REMINDERS

City of Woodbury Winter Parking Rules are in effect through April 1, 2013. No vehicles are permitted on city streets between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. After any accumulation of two or more inches of snow, vehicles are banned from on-street parking until snow removal is complete.

Our contract with A-1 Maintenance specifications for winter indicates:

- 1. Driveways will be cleared after at least 1.5 inches of snow have accumulated.
- 2. Driveways will initially be opened up to allow access prior to 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. when continuous snow accumulation reaches 4 inches
- 3. Driveways will be cleared within 8 hours of cessation for snow depths of 1.5 8 inches and within 12 hours of cessation for snow depths over 8 inches.
- A snowfall lasting 24 hours or more with an accumulation of at least 1.5 inches will be cleared to allow access.
- 5. Driveways that become closed by the city plows will be opened near the street.
- Sidewalk snow removal criteria are the same as for driveways, but sidewalks are generally cleared <u>after</u> the driveways have been completed.
- A-1 Maintenance is not responsible for damage to any electrical cords which may be buried under snow on the sidewalks.
- 8. Sidewalk snow removal will be delayed if wind chill temperatures reach 25 degrees

below zero until safer conditions prevail.

Homeowners remain responsible for removal of snow from:

- Sidewalks and driveways for accumulations of less than 1.5 inches
- Driveways due to parked cars
- Roofs, decks and patios
- Driveways or sidewalks caused by roof clearing
- Ice accumulation from water drainage on sidewalks, steps and driveways.

<u>Please do not run electrical cords</u> <u>across driveways or sidewalks</u>. If vehicles parked in the driveway prohibit safe plowing without causing damage, plowing may be omitted.

COMMITTEE CHAIRS

Karl Bozicevich, Architectural Control Committee

Karl and his wife Sharon have 3 grown children, two grand-kids and 1 "grand puppy", and have lived in the community since January 2005 upon relocation from Florida back home to Minnesota.

He has a strong background in the construction industry, beginning as a carpenter apprentice and working until he retired this year and closed his construction management firm. Most of Karl's experience was in commercial construction with an emphasis on large retail, education and multi-family projects.

Karl inherited the Committee chair position nearly 3 years ago from the able leadership of Louise Jacobs and during his tenure they have had only a few requests to consider. The Architectural Control Committee is a wonderful group of diligent, respectful and forward-looking neighbors, and Karl finds it a pleasure to serve with them.

Since his retirement, Karl continues to teach at the U of MN where he is an adjunct faculty member. He is also an avid woodworker, chess player and grandpa.

Ray Buczkowski, Maintenance Committee

Ray is a retired 3Mer who was heavily involved in the development of new computer applications. He has lived in our community for thirteen years and has been a member of the Maintenance Committee nearly the entire time, serving as chairperson for the last year.

He has been involved with all the projects and problems that have surfaced including:

- Yearly walk-around to check on maintenance issues
- Selecting a different maintenance service
- Replacing mail boxes and wood newspaper boxes with the black boxes currently in service
- Upgrading our current irrigation sprinkler system
- Insuring the utility boxes stay in good condition
