NEW RECYCLING BINS

Maroney's has begun the process of switching everyone to single-sort recycling. With this method, you will be provided a 64 gallon cart with wheels and a green lid. All recycling materials can be placed in the cart loose and mixed. Check for more details at www.maroneysinc.com. Their two sort trucks will continue to collect your recycling until the single-sort carts are delivered.

With the new system, all paper, cardboard, junk mail and phone books, milk and juice cartons, plastic bottles and tubs #1 through #7, glass bottles and jars along with aluminum and tin cans can be mixed in one container.

Maroney's will use the same type of collection vehicles for both trash and recycling. You must continue to keep trash and recycling items separate since they are brought to different facilities.

If you feel your garage cannot accommodate another large bin, phone Maroney's, (651) 439-7279, to request a smaller size.

SHREDDING/RECYCLING

Washington County will host a free document shredding event at the Environmental Center in Woodbury, 4039 Cottage Grove Drive, on Friday, September 21, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Bring your confidential and personal papers to be shredded onsite by Shred Right. You don't have to remove staples and paper clips. CDs, floppy disks and other media will be accepted for off-site destruction.

If you have used fluorescent bulbs that need to be disposed of, do not throw them into the trash. Because they contain a small amount of mercury, they must be recycled. Bring them to the Washington County Environmental Center for recycling.

Cell phones: Woodbury Parks and Recreation partners with agencies to

either recycle or refurbish phones for use in developing countries. Used cell phones can be dropped off in the collection boxes at Central Park and City Hall.
