gutters and Sump pumps, friend or foe? Simply downspouts: pumping water outside your home or collecting it via gutters and down spouts is not sufficient if it flows to a location where it will return to haunt you. Water pumped into the rock bed surrounding your own or your neighbor's home may settle around the foundation and eventually cause basement flooding. Instead, the

water should be transported to a grassy area or sloped away from the home where it cannot return to cause problems. Several homes in our association have incurred water damage due to failure to properly direct the water.
