TRASH REMINDERS

Because of the Thanksgiving holiday on Thursday, November 27, trash collection will be one day later than normal, Friday, November 28.

Cardboard should be flattened and sized to fit into your recycle bin.

Place your recycling and trash bins at the end of your driveway, <u>not on</u> the street or lawn, and separate them by at least two feet.

Put carts out no sooner than dark in the evening before collection and return them to your garage at the end of the collection day.

AMAZING CUCUMBERS
