BOARD TWEETS

The Board voted to move forward with the locking mailbox project when weather and time permit, probably this spring. Total cost estimate is approximately \$5,500.00. Complete details were provided in the February Board Meeting Minutes.

Previous estimates exceeded \$20,000 to totally replace the current structures and install new locked mailboxes but the committee determined that most posts are sound so only the cross pieces need to be replaced, and the plastic tubes under the current boxes will not be replaced.

The selected locking mailboxes will be purchased from Menard's using a discount available to Personal Touch Management. Boxes are estimated at \$34-\$40 each, slightly lower than the price on Amazon.com. Additional costs will include new cross pieces, post covers, new numbers and other construction materials and supplies.

Karl Bozicevich has agreed to remove and replace the crossbars and install the locking mailboxes with the assistance of Association volunteers. If you are willing to help, please phone Karl at (651) 739-6067 or email him at karlboz@gmail.com. We need some additional volunteers!
