A major focus of the meeting was planning for 2018. Board members outlined priorities, projects and activities needing attention, such as a By-Laws review, researching landscaping companies and services, conducting a community survey, etc.

The Board typically meets on the second Wednesday of each month. You are welcome to attend Board meetings; simply notify any Board member so we know to expect you. To maintain a good idea of the activities of the Board, review the minutes each month at the sources listed above.

#### PLOWING/PARKING

Information for new homeowners and a reminder for the rest of us:

Woodbury's winter parking rules began November 1. On-street parking is banned between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. and continues through April 1, 2018. The city ordinance also prohibits onstreet parking any time two or more inches of snow have accumulated until after the street has been completely plowed.

Residents who violate the ordinance will be ticketed. To avoid receiving a ticket, also please tell any guests who visit you about the city restrictions.

On recycling days, keep trash and recycling containers on your driveway, NOT ON THE STREET, so the plow won't hit them.

Our contract with A-1 Maintenance remains the same as last year regarding snow removal for driveways and sidewalks.

 Driveways will be cleared after at least 1.5 inches of snow have accumulated.

- 2. Driveways will initially be opened up to allow access prior to 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. when continuous snow accumulation reaches 4 inches.
- Driveways will be cleared within 8 hours of cessation for snow depths of 1.5 8 inches and within 12 hours of cessation for snow depths over 8 inches.
- A snowfall lasting 24 hours or more with an accumulation of at least 1.5 inches will be cleared to allow access.
- 5. Driveways that become closed by the city plows will be opened near the street.
- Sidewalk snow removal criteria are the same as for driveways, but sidewalks are generally cleared <u>after</u> the driveways have been completed.
- A-1 Maintenance is not responsible for damage to any electrical cords which may be buried under snow on the sidewalks.
- 8. Sidewalk snow removal will be delayed if wind chill temperatures reach 25 degrees below zero until safer conditions prevail.

Homeowners remain responsible for removal of snow from:

- Sidewalks and driveways for accumulations of less than 1.5 inches
- Driveways due to parked cars
- Roofs, decks and patios
- Driveways or sidewalks caused by roof clearing
- Ice accumulation from water drainage on sidewalks, steps and driveways.

<u>Please do not run electrical cords</u> <u>across driveways or sidewalks</u>. If vehicles parked in the driveway prohibit safe plowing without causing damage, driveway plowing may be omitted.
