These problems are compounded by school buses picking up and dropping off young children twice daily. We have called the city of Woodbury asking for help but have received none up to this point. Suggestions for a speed bump, a posted lower speed limit of perhaps 25 mph and/or a traffic speed sensor were dismissed.

Calls to the police department for assistance by a police officer perhaps observing from a particular location to catch offenders, especially during rush hour, were also dismissed.

Parking on both sides of Woodduck Drive presents an additional problem by narrowing both passage and visibility. We are frustrated but will continue efforts to get help; the next step may be to attend a City Council meeting. If anyone is interested in this approach, please let us know and we will arrange an appointment. Please

know we share your concerns and will welcome any suggestions and/or assistance. Thank you.
